



Irrigation Program Works with Water and Energy Partners to Design and Implement New Systems and Create New Jobs

Overview

The Farmers Conservation Alliance (FCA) leads the Irrigation Modernization Program, which provides agricultural, environmental, and community benefits. The FCA partners with Oregon Water Resources Congress, Community Renewable Energy Association, and others on this program, which involves designing and implementing new irrigation systems and provides 22,790 short-term jobs.

Notable Features

- The program modernizes agricultural infrastructure.
 FCA works with operators of irrigation water delivery systems throughout the West to build a pipeline of shovel-ready projects, including project identification, qualification of benefits, permitting, financing, and construction.
- It communicates the multiple benefits of modern irrigation systems. FCA works at the state and national levels to highlight the benefits of irrigation modernization, including providing a portfolio of modernization projects that increase agricultural security and enhance environmental benefits.
- It reduces costs for project planning. FCA leverages funding from government, philanthropic, and other private stakeholders to more efficiently move irrigation districts from concept to installed projects on the ground.
